For instance, the 11MP setting of the 5D Mark III has way more detail than any of the 12MP native Nikon cameras. To use it, set AI focus and all area mode. That's obvious, but what's not is that if you press the center of the thumb nubbin again, it will return instantly to the offcenter sensor you had selected! If you need more details about what you're setting, press the SET button again, but it's not necessary. The instant you've changed something, it's done. This is handy for when you first get the camera as your preferences finalize, but I'd set it back to its default of fixed after you get comfortable. This is what I saved that changes for me from setting to setting. It is off by default. You set it by pressing Everything stays the same, except that blown-out highlights might not blow out, but only if you're lucky. This example is the one time it actually did. It only pulls in about one more stop, and when you've lost a highlight, it usually is either further overexposed than that, or it's OK without any of these shenanigans. This author does the best job of explaining the mechanics of this camera of all the other books on photography I own. Buy it and you will find you will constantly go back and reread sections as you use your camera. It is not necessarily the book you want if you are looking for a how to book on photography technique. She includes good tips but the technical content and description of controls is the real strength of this book. The manual for Canon cameras is excellent, and I was easily able to set up the camera to shoot. However, this book gives you some helpful hints that are not gone into in detail in the manual, and is a mini review course in exposure and the use of Manual mode. There are little tips throughout which add to the experience of this exceptional camera body. The one area that this book handles, and which the manual lacks, is an explanation of AF and the 61 AF points.
