Both Similes and Metaphores draw comparisons between two or more things; however, there are some key differences between them. Similes always use the word as the word to make comparison. Metaphores don't use the word as or as. Consequently, metaphors can be more implicit and difficult to identify. He was lost in the blue sky, not surrounded by his eyes. This is an example of a metaphor. He was comparing his eyes to heaven, but that was not explicitly done. The comparison is implied. Here's the same example, but it became a simile. His eyes are like the blue sky, without surrounding. This is an example of a simil. In this case, the comparison is more explicit. It is easier to identify that the speaker is making a comparison. Thank you for visiting! A metaphor is a word or phrase used to describe something like something else. A metaphor is not a comparison - it is a simile, where one thing is said to be "like" another ("Your eyes were like diamonds.") Instead, a metaphor is simply a statement you're saying one thing is another. Take a look at the example of a metaphor in the bubble of the speech above. The man is saying "Life is a roller coaster." Think of what this phrase means - does it mean that your life is actually a real life skating? Or did he describe it like that because it means that his life has ups and downs, similar to a roller coaster? Example of metaphors The best of metaphors is that their possibilities are infinite! You can describe absolutely anything using a metaphor, including objects, people, places, animals and things. Here are some common metaphors you may have heard people say: Franklin has a heart of gold! The voice of Mary is music for my ears It's an encyclopedia walking You're my sun The world is a scenario Did you recognize any of those metaphors? Did you hear people tell them before, read them in a book or use them yourself? When people use metaphors they are describing the situation as something else, usually for the emphasis. They don't literally mean what they're saying. For example: Franklin has a heart of gold! Franklin has no heart made of gold! This metaphor is used to emphasize how kind and loving Franklin is, as if he were filled with lovely things, like gold. Mary's voice is music for my ears; Music does not come out of Mary's mouth when she speaks! This metaphor emphasizes the pleasant sound of Mary's voice - how to hear it is as pleasant as listening to music. It's a walking encyclopedia: Is there aa book walking through the room? Probably not!is saying that the child has so much knowledge - it's like an encyclopedia. You are my sun: Do you really mean that this person is a sun of real life? This metaphor describes how the person is happy and bright â like the sun! The world is a stage: This metaphor is used to say that people's lives are full of drama because so many things happen, so you are comparing the world to a stage theater.
